

Program Description

The IDGCG Program focuses on the practical application of academic research to ever-evolving global issues and challenges with a focus on global governance, international relations, information and communication and expanding markets and business. This program draws upon the expertise of distinguished faculty members, who have proven themselves in the academia with substantial publications and numerous national research projects to their credentials.

Upon selection, students are required to undergo a rigorous taught and research training program before embarking on their specific research work under the guidance of respective supervisors. The courses are taught in English and designed to introduce the students to theoretical and methodological concepts and nourish their critical thinking, problem solving and presentation skills. In addition to the personal guidance from designated supervisors, students will have access to a range of academic activities such as seminars, workshops, conferences, field trips and industry visits to support and develop their writing and research skills.

IDGCG is designed to meet the requirements of rapid changing dynamics of communication and governance systems. The program will concomitantly enable the graduates to enhance not just their research but soft skills to contribute meaningfully in their area of specialization. Central to the IDGCG are both multidisciplinary approaches and international perspectives. Graduates will be equipped with philosophical, theoretical and hands-on expertise required in global communication and governance to meet the challenges in global communication industry and international information flows, and to enhance international socio-economic progress in line with the global, regional and national communication trends.

This is a full-time degree program equipped with face-to-face classes, interactions, presentations, case studies, simulations and industrial visits to support and help students with their various learning needs. Prospective students are expected to join the program led by competent professors in 4 thematic research areas: global communication theories, international culture market, constructive communication, public diplomacy and global internet governance. Students will be awarded Doctor of Arts in Communication Studies upon successful completion of the program.

Admission Criteria

- Applicants should have academic credentials that equate with Master's degree in China, age under 50 and provide academic credentials paper of at least two recommendation letters issued by associate professors;
- 2. Applicants should be non-Chinese citizens with valid passport;
- 3. Applicant should have educational background or working experience in relevance to the subject of study;
- Applicant must be proficient in English language. In the absence of a valid TOEFL or IELTS, it is required to provide equivalent English language proficiency credentials;

Program Duration: Three Academic Years

Course Requirements

The IDGCG consists of modules on multidisciplinary approaches to global communication and governance research, social science research methods, academic writing, introduction to Chinese language and other specific skills relevant to doctoral research. Students are required to attend a compulsory coursework during the first two semesters. First semester comprises of seven courses with 16 credits and second semester have three courses with 6 credits.

In order to fulfill the requirements of the IDGCG, students must successfully complete a minimum of 7 mandatory core courses in a full-time manner. All students are required to attend and pass the Pro-seminar and mandatory common core courses.

Under the supervision of the ICSF faculties, each student is required to submit a dissertation within the stipulated time-frame to be eligible for the final defense. This dissertation must indicates their thorough understanding of existing knowledge, expertise over the employed methodologies, theoretical frameworks applied and the nature of independent and original contribution made to their field of study.

Students are expected to complete the program in three years. They are allowed to request for suspension, retention or extension with reasonable justification. The maximum valid duration of the program is limited to eight years. The study consists of six major stages; course work, proposal defense, mid-term examination, peer-review dissertation, preliminary and final dissertation defense.

Assessment Criteria

All the teaching and supervision is designed to equip the students to deal with nuances of their proposed research; conceptualization of the research topic, identification of suitable research design, appropriate methods for data collection, analysis, interpretation and defending their arguments with authority.

Courses: All students are required to attend and pass several compulsory courses in the first academic year (two semesters) in a full-time manner with the minimum requirement of 13 credits.

Proposal Defense: At the end of the first academic year, there would be a proposal defense, for which the students are required to finish first three chapters including literature review and research design. Successful completion of proposal defense is required to proceed to further stages of the study.

Mid-term Examination: All students have to attend a mid-term examination at the end of the second academic year in order to proceed to the final defense. In the mid-term examination, students will be asked to report and present their progress after the proposal defense. More completed chapter drafts should be attached to the examination report.

Peer Reviewing : The doctoral dissertation is subject to an anonymous peer-review. Students need approvals from at least two anonymous reviewers in order to qualify for the final defense.

Preliminary and Final Defenses: Qualified students are required to complete and submit their revised drafts as per instructions and comments from the anonymous reviewers and supervisors before they attend the preliminary defenses. Only those who pass the preliminary defenses are eligible to proceed to the final defense.

Dissertation: A candidate has the obligation to prepare a dissertation of not more than 80,000 words that makes a significant contribution to research in Global Communication and Governance.

If the language of any application material is not Chinese or English, please provide notarized translation in Chinese or English.

Original documents will be verified upon registration if considered necessary by admission officer. Application fee is nonrefundable.

Candidate application is considered valid only if the application is completed and fees is paid.

Admission and Registration

Students will be notified of admission result via application system. Letter of Admission and student visa application materials will be mailed to student's mailing address provided in admission system within 2 weeks after the announcement of results.

Students are allowed to enter People's Republic of China only with a valid student visa on a regular passport. Registration will take place in the month of September. An exact date will be mentioned in the Letter of Admission.

Upon registration at the University, students have to purchase a Comprehensive Insurance & Protection Scheme for Foreigners Staying in China of Pingan Annuity Insurance Company as recommended by the Ministry of Education.

Accommodation

After registration, students could check-in at campus dormitory for international students with their Letter of Admission. Since the number of rooms in the dormitory is limited, the university cannot guarantee on-campus housing for every international student.
